- Software updates are too difficult



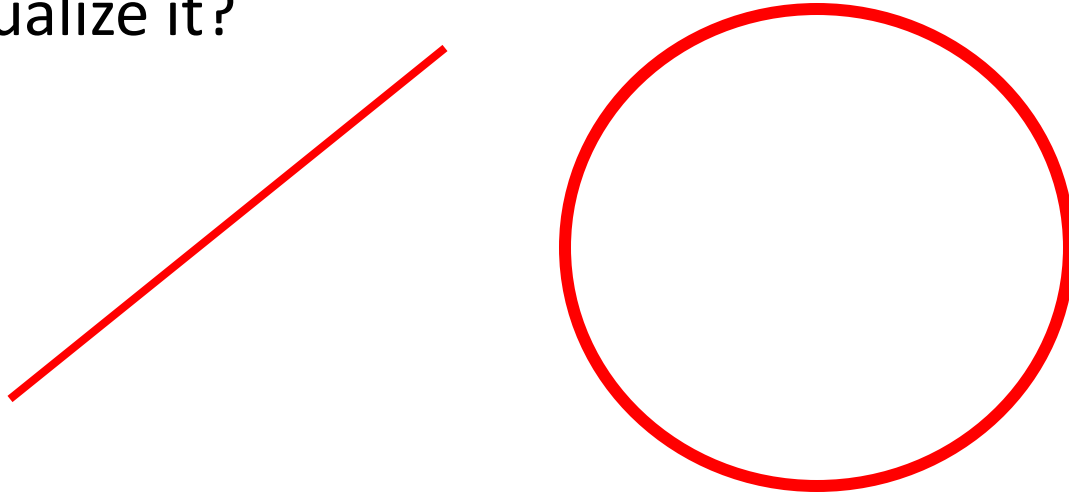
Startup mindset:

- Not having long-term plans.

- Launch MLP – Minimum Loveable Product
 - Smallest possible thing you can build to fulfill the basic narrative and delight the users
- Lean approach
- Data driven
- Launch and learn, I don't wanna show you twice
- Learn what's wrong and remove the uncertainty
- Release frequency too high, build every day



Minimalism in it's pure form

- No noise, distractions... Peacefulness?
- Try to visualize it?



- It's a lifestyle.
- Different types: Aesthetic, Essential, Experiential, Sustainable, Thrifty
- Focus on thrifty – on time, on budget, faster time to market



Minimalism: it's all about

Overall Numbers

Let's start with some usage numbers about new Reddit. It's hard to believe that we started the alpha testing of new Reddit way back in [August 2017](#). We opened it up to beta testers in March of 2018, and in April we began to increase the number of redditors who

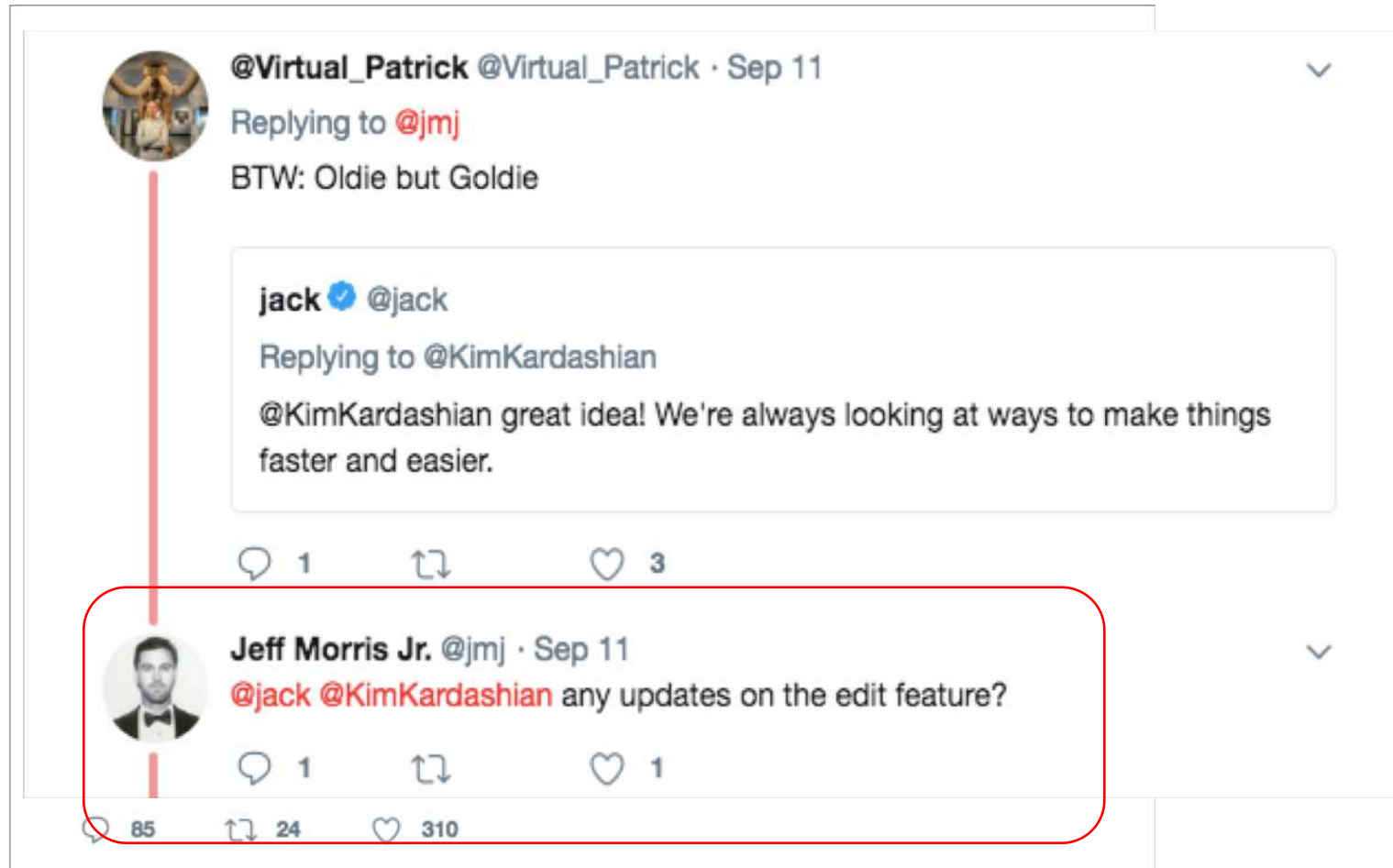
